EMOR's Goal:

Promote job growth and protect the environment by helping schools, healthcare facilities and local businesses and institutions to recycle more.



- Counties responsible to meet State goal
 - Recycling and organics management targets have been increased by MPCA
 - Solid Waste Master Plans guide decisionmaking
- Policy Direction
 - Promote the East Metro economy, while meeting environmental goals
 - Do it without mandates



Strategic direction:
Waste is inefficiency – use the market to encourage recovery of resources from waste, and reduce cost to business.



Counties' Approach: Use the market

Structure public costs to encourage efficiency

- County Environmental Charge for Non-Residential Generators: Ramsey 53%, Washington 38%
- State Solid Waste Management Tax 17%
- Recycling and organics management is exempt.
 By diverting waste from the garbage to recycling, it is possible for costs to go down.

Provide resources to assist businesses to change waste management approaches



- 1. Create a website to serve as an anchor for resources
- Provide no-cost consulting and technical assistance services tailored to generators types
- 3. Market the website and services
- 4. Implement ways to assist the industry and businesses with financial barriers



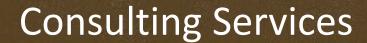


•MN Waste Wise:

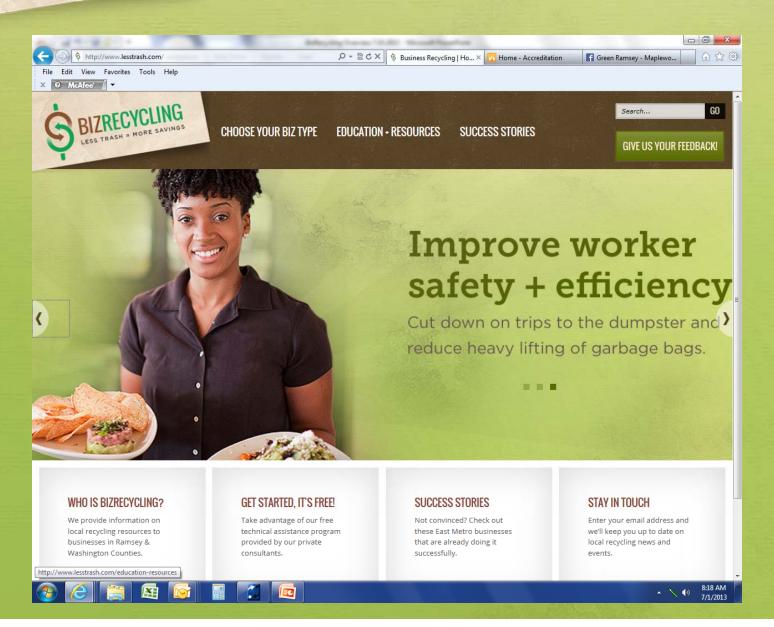

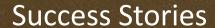

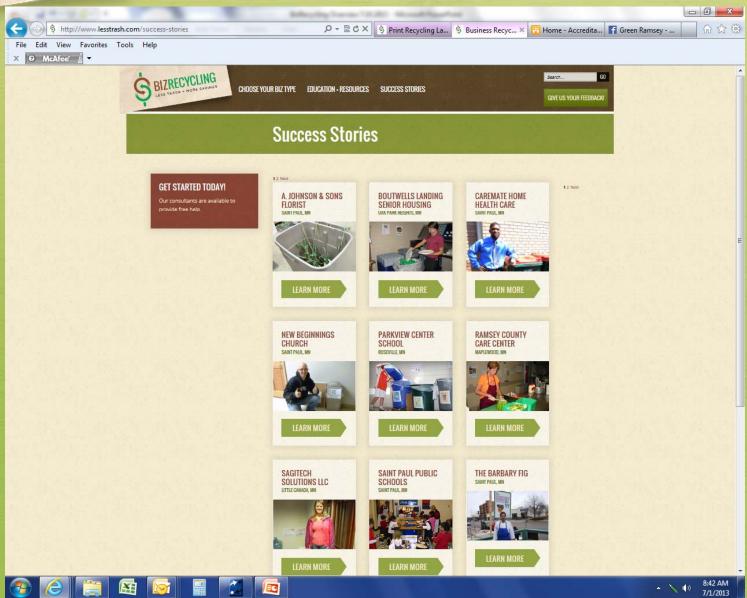

Action Requested

Direct staff to prepare implementation plans to address, first, organic waste collection and transportation efficiency, either through hauler rebates or generator incentive grants, and, second, for targeted grants to non-residential waste generators, and to bring those plans back to the Project Board for consideration at the September meeting.



Goal:

Assist the industry to increase the collection efficiency for organic waste from non-residential generators, leading to an economically sustainable collection system.

Originated in discussions with industry in 2011



Four Options

- 1. Pay for transfer station capacity
- 2. Rebates to haulers
- 3. Rebates to generators
- 4. New accounts pilot program



- Foth had multiple conversations/inquiries to industry members
- Each option had varying degrees of support
- All supported robust education and training
- General, but not unanimous support for hauler rebates and new organic waste accounts pilot
- Some, but mixed interest in direct rebates and transfer station



- Purpose: to help businesses bridge barriers to starting or improving recycling and organics management
- Variety of barriers have been documented
- Staff examined similar programs
- General structure proposed:
 - Eligibility, administration, amounts, reporting
